August – The speaker is Harish Shah, one of our own members, a keen student of British Indian history. PRELUDE

Year 1942.

Japanese Gen. Tomoyuki Yamashita attacked Singapore on 8th February, with 35,000 men. The defender, Lieutenant General Arthur Ernest Percival, had 85,000 men and Singapore was considered to be an invincible fortress and yet, he surrendered unconditionally on 15th February. That was while Gen. Yamashita himself was considering a withdrawal from the island of Singapore!

There were 22,000 Australian soldiers in Singapore. 14,972 were taken prisoner. Of the remaining, some died fighting and others escaped. Among the escapees was Major General Bennett; two post-war inquiries found him to be unjustified in leaving his command.

The loss of almost a quarter of Australia's overseas soldiers, and the failure of the Singapore Strategy had stunned the country.

Amongst the POWs, there were 45,000 Indian soldiers of the British Indian Army. They had left their homeland and loved ones to fight for their oppressors and defend Singapore. They were demoralised and felt debased and betrayed by their surrender under order by the meek British command.

Gen. Percival was well placed but surrendered after just five days of fighting. In stark contrast, an Indian civilian, Mr. Subhash Chandra Bose, having no military experience, left Germany in a submarine, travelling through enemy infested waters, he reached Singapore to organise these demoralised Indian POWS into a fighting force again.

He called his army, the Indian National Army (INA for short). Besides the Indian POWs, it recruited Indian ex-pat men and women from Malaya. He even created a woman's Regiment, who took up arms and fought the British forces in the jungles of Burma. He had only two criteria for recruiting; adults of Indian origin and willingness to fight for India's freedom. Thus, INA turned out to be a true representation of a united India.

The INA soldiers marched 3550 Kms from Singapore to Burma. The hungry and exhausted army had but one aim, to throw the British out of India. It succeeded in doing so. The outcome got delayed due to the Japanese surrender in 1945. However, the British were forced to leave India by 1947 and that triggered the winddown of the British Empire. The corrupt despot-ruling politicians of independent India made concerted efforts to erase all memories of the INA from peoples' minds. Hence the name "Forgotten Army". But the DNA of the "Forgotten Army" lives on in the present-day Indian Army and in the hearts of every nationalistic Indian at home and abroad. The new ruling government (since2014) has reinstated Subhash Chandra Bose into his rightful place in the modern Indian history.

During my talk, you will view unseen original footage from that era, discover shocking secrets and learn the truth behind distorted facts and propaganda.
