Castlemaine trip 13 – 15 November 2025

Twenty-Two Probus Club members went to Castlemaine primarily to take a nostalgic trip on the "J" Class Steam engine No 549 that departed from the Castlemaine railway station then travelled to its destination at the Maldon railway station and return.

The Probus trippers made their way to Castlemaine by a car share arrangement which worked out well for all those who made the trip and stayed for two nights at the Castle Motel. The accommodation at the motel was close to the City Centre of Castlemaine where the group had their various breakfasts, lunches and dinners while in Castlemaine at venues that could accommodate us all.

Apart from the various food venues we went to, the Probus members were also treated to a tour of the historic Buda House and its beautiful gardens. If you are ever in Castlemaine a visit to the Buda House is highly recommended.

Our trip on the historic steam train was really an all-day affair that began after we had breakfast at the Blackbird café. The train departed just after 11.30 am and took about 45 minutes to arrive at Maldon station. The weather for the trip was absolutely perfect, a beautiful sunny day, no wind or rain at all. I'm quite sure that everyone enjoyed the trip on this fantastic old train, in particular the beautiful old carriages we were in were just fabulous. At Maldon we all went and had a look around this very historic town, which is really now catering to tourists, but I did notice on walking around that they do have quite a large fully operational local old style car garage that is in the Centre of Maldon's main street. Some of our group walked from the Maldon station to Maldon town center — a good stretch of the legs for those who did so — they also walked back to the Maldon station to catch the return trip back to Castlemaine. On our return trip some of us enjoyed drinks and cheese platters all part of the service at a small cost. The service was very good on board and at the stations (both Castlemaine and Maldon) that service being solely provided by volunteers who staff the train as well as the chaps who actually drove the engine. It was my second time on this train tour and I highly recommend it to anyone.

Our final destination for those Probus members who wanted to do something further before returning home was a visit "Mica Grange" which is located in a place called Sutton Grange and not too far off the beaten track from Castlemaine. Mica is only open between the month of November and for a few weeks into December each year. It is privately run and contains quite a large area of land which is filled with various modern types of sculptures that are dotted over the landscape, and most are for sale. There is also a café/restaurant available and many of the group from Probus who visited Mica had refreshments there by way of tea or soft drinks or even the savory scones that were also on offer.

All in all the Castlemaine trip was really quite a fabulous two-day trip and congratulations to Sandra and Ree for organising it.
